

## **The Jewish Tradition In Florence**

The Jewish world doesn't feature in the traditional image of the capital town of Tuscany, which is instead renowned as the cradle of the Renaissance, the city of Dante and Michelangelo. Yet, precisely in the 15th century - il Quattrocento – one of the periods of maximum splendour in the history of the city -, a Jewish community settled in Florence, becoming a continuous element of its life and giving important cultural contribution.

The visit, a walk through the city centre, has the purpose to explain the local facts and history of the Jewish community, along with notions on Judaism. It will include the beautiful 19th century synagogue and its museum (subject to entrance fee).
